the seniors that are there. And I also gave it to other seniors that already graduated that are still living in the complex, because it's also, they're eligible, too, to get it, if they're already in college.

THE CHAIRMAN: Would we have any way of identifying any families that have high school children or college-age kids?

MS. GILMORE: Well, we would go through our residents list and pick the age out. That's why I sent it over to Harrison High School just to make sure, and then send it out, too, even though it's a double.

THE CHAIRMAN: Joe, would you do me a favor? Would you be able to go through your rolls and pick out -- and unfortunately I know this from being in charge of the foundation, we have kids that come in June and go, Oh, I didn't know, I didn't know about it. And we're like, Well, you know, it's tough with your head high to look at the bulletin board.

MS. GILMORE: And we also put it on our bulletin board too, and a letter to everyone.

Mr. Rogers contacted my firm, and the first one is in the amount of \$11,725. A few important

things to know about change orders. If the amount of the change order exceeds 20 percent of the overall contract, we actually have to bid it out. In this case it did not, and the cumulative amount of change orders is under 20 percent.

The key for both was that the conditions that were discovered on site were unforeseeable at the time the bid was put together, and essentially what occurred was that in the first one cracks developed in the sidewalks surrounding the center circle at Harrison Gardens, and the work needed to be done or it would have resulted in not only a work stoppage, but costly damage until the areas were repaved.

The second one is for \$5,500, and relates to our CCTV system. Again, well under the 20 percent both individually and cumulatively. And, in this case, during excavation a fiber cable was discovered that was encased in concrete and buried to an insufficient depth so that it needed to be remedied on site to avoid further problems with the project and to avoid work stoppage. The work was done on an emergency basis, so what's before you this
