23	for the extermination company, and I reviewed
24	those with Mr. Gilmore. And the bidder that we
25	had, there's a supplier that we had this year is

the lowest bidder, and I recommend the Board adopt that. And we have the three professional people, the auditor, the attorney and the accountant, and I recommend them not just because they were the only proposals, but we've been working with them for years, and I recommend them.

And I have been working with the security person and met with him a couple of times, and I'll be meeting with him within the next two or three working days and clarify his schedule, and Mr. Gilmore has had a lot of input into that. And I think that's about all.

And I congratulate our new, not our new, but our chairperson and vice chairperson.

Glad to see them going in the right direction all the time.

THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Roy.

COMMISSIONER PETTIGREW: Thank you.

THE CHAIRMAN: Yeah. At one point I'll have a conversation with you also, Roy, about the schedule for security. Just some ideas in that.

DIRECTOR ROGERS: Yeah. We're making a major change in that.

THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. I appreciate

2	DIRECTOR ROGERS: Which will improve
3	his schedule.
4	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay, that's good.
5	The air conditioning. Gene, were they
6	under warranty at all? How old are those units?
7	MR. GILMORE: The units for the
8	apartments are, I believe, eight, ten years old.
9	THE CHAIRMAN: Oh, really, that old?
10	Wow.
11	MR. GILMORE: Yeah, it's fast. We had
12	one go down last year that just missed, and of
13	course they don't stretch anything out anymore.
14	But, no, there was
15	COMMISSIONER CONFESSORE: The
16	condenser. They last about 10 years.
17	MR. GILMORE: Yeah, before you start
18	having problems with it. I mean, so far we
19	really haven't had that big a deal with, you
20	know, as many units as we have.
21	THE CHAIRMAN: Right.
22	MR. GILMORE: You know, there's two for
23	each building, except for 9.

THE CHAIRMAN: What was the problem

with it?

MR. GILMORE: It must have took a surge, and it's something I was going to talk to Roy about. Because the PC panel, these are very complicated, so they have a PC board, and the controller actually burned out. So we're assuming it took a surge.

THE CHAIRMAN: Interestingly enough, I have the same problem across the street. And I have a feeling we're on the same grid, but PSE&G claims there's never surges.

MR. GILMORE: Yeah, never. But I was talking to Arctic Air, and they said there's actually surge protectors that we can put on the units to protect them from that. Because the last one I believe was a similar problem, so it's something that I'm looking into to prevent the same thing from happening.

THE CHAIRMAN: Good. Okeydoke.

DIRECTOR ROGERS: Also, the Board should be aware that Mr. Gilmore is buying -- now we're getting experience of what parts are wearing out, so we're buying spare parts in advance so that when something breaks down we don't have to wait for two or three working days to get it ordered and sent across the United

States to us. We're going to stock it, and we should be able to get air conditioners back on line in short notice.

THE CHAIRMAN: Good.

COMMISSIONER PETTIGREW: Do we have anybody on staff that knows the ins and outs of air conditioners?

DIRECTOR ROGERS: I would say

Mr. Gilmore is probably the only one. But we do
have -- can you answer that for me, Mr. Gilmore?

MR. GILMORE: I'm sorry?

MS. GILMORE: He wants you to answer it about if someone is on staff.

COMMISSIONER PETTIGREW: Is there anybody on staff?

MR. GILMORE: Do we have a service person? No, nobody that has a license that can handle that. These units are quite big, and when these were installed years ago the person that's working on them is actually the general, the contractor that worked for the contractor that put these in. So he knows the system inside and out more so than I do. I mean, I can, you know, I communicate with him a lot on the phone to try stuff before he gets here.
