maybe about two weeks, Dr. D, but it's not going
to be an issue, I don't think, at all.

We did have quite a bit of snow, and I would like to inform the Board that our maintenance guys, they did an unbelievable job of clearing it, salting. We've had no reports of any slippages by any tenants whatsoever, and we've had a lot of snow, so I just wanted to make

- THE CHAIRMAN: Great. Good job to all,
- 3 and thank you.
- 4 How did we do with, without mentioning
- any names, did everybody who we've scheduled get
- 6 vaccinated?
- 7 DIRECTOR LUCAS: Everyone except for
- 8 one of my maintenance men got vaccinated.
- 9 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. What we set up
- 10 | worked out okay?
- 11 DIRECTOR LUCAS: Yes. Thank, Dr. D.
- 12 For the record, too, for anyone who wants to
- 13 know, Dr. Doran helped me get my staff -- some of
- 14 my older employees got vaccinated, but we were
- 15 | having trouble going back and forth with the
- 16 | county, we were essential personnel and then they
- 17 | said they didn't have it. And then Dr. D made
- 18 one phone call, and we all got vaccinated. I had
- 19 | some of my maintenance men said no, said yes as

COMMISSIONER MILLER: The boiler. related to the emergency, I don't know when to 3 bring that up. 4 5 DIRECTOR LUCAS: You can bring that up 6 now. 7 THE CHAIRMAN: Say it again, Rich? COMMISSIONER MILLER: It has do with 8 9 the boiler repair. 10 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, you can bring it up 11 now. 12 COMMISSIONER MILLER: I'm not bringing 13 it up related to -- but we're having similar 14 problems around town, so I think there might be 15 something going on. It might be conjecturing. 16 I'm having problems at the hotel, and we're 17 having problems at other places, and I think it could be related to the water. 18 19 DIRECTOR LUCAS: Well, we looked at our 20 boilers. One day I got a call from Gene, and it looked like smoke coming out of one of our --21 2.2 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Oh, no, no, I'm 23 not questioning A & S, but saying there might be 24 something with the water in Harrison where something is going on that we're having systemic 25

failures all over town. You're a couple miles away from my other buildings, and I've had a very similar thing with the boilers.

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MR. GILMORE: Harrison has pretty hard water, so we use a treatment, a chemical treatment. Are they steam or is it water?

COMMISSIONER MILLER: We've got a combination. But we're looking into an electronic -- I'm just, this is something when maintenance is coming it's the kind of the thing that I, you know, for want of a nail the kingdom was lost. I didn't know we were doing water treatment or something like that, but I don't know how often you test to see which chemicals you use to see if it is something that is specific. In other words, if you've got a certain kind of ferrous or iron in your water, you use one kind of system. We're going away from the chemicals, we're trying an electronic system that will get rid of the chemicals without -- get rid of the heavy metals without chemicals.

THE CHAIRMAN: Who said the water was hard here?

25 COMMISSIONER CHOFFO: Our system is

- 1 | treated, too, at the school system, Dr. Doran.
- 2 They have a water treatment too.
- THE CHAIRMAN: Have we had any issues
- 4 at the schools, Dan?
- 5 COMMISSIONER CHOFFO: No, not other
- 6 than our regular issues.
- 7 COMMISSIONER MILLER: To give you a
- 8 heads up, where we found it, because a lot of new
- 9 buildings are built with plastic water systems,
- 10 | they call it the PEC system, which the high
- 11 | school was most likely done. It's not going to
- 12 show up. It will show up on the valve where the
- 13 | valve started to freeze -- I'm just giving you,
- 14 | it's the kind of thing...
- 15 MR. GILMORE: Right, right. You could
- 16 | have an electrolosis problem.
- 17 | COMMISSIONER MILLER: I'm just saying
- 18 that we're all in different assets here in town,
- 19 you've got the school, I've got the --
- 20 THE CHAIRMAN: We've got the new
- 21 school.
- 22 | COMMISSIONER MILLER: And the reason
- 23 | I'm bringing it up now is when I saw you had the
- 24 | water problem, we've been through the same thing
- 25 | in the month of December at the hotel. So I'm

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1	not questioning, but maybe we should all look				
2	into if Passaic Valley Water has changed some				
3	compound in there and, you know, it's within,				
4	it's totally within the parameters of what the				
5	water is allowed to be, but if they're changing				
6	something coming from Passaic Water and we're not				
7	treating the new kind of water coming from				
8	Passaic, it's affecting our valves and that				
9	stuff, which then affects the boiler. I'm just				
10	throwing it out.				
11	THE CHAIRMAN: Rich, just for the heck				
12	of it I'll have Bobby Van Riper look into that,				
13	that maybe there are some unrelated boiler				
14	problems that could be related to the water.				
15	COMMISSIONER MILLER: Because right now				
16	you've got a boiler problem, I've got multiple				
17	issues.				

DIRECTOR LUCAS: Well, we can also forward you, Dr. D, a list of the chemicals we use. Rich, if you want a list of chemicals we use, we can definitely send that over to you.

COMMISSIONER MILLER: Yeah, that would be great.

DIRECTOR LUCAS: Okay. I'll send that over first thing in the a.m.

Aye.

COMMISSIONER MUSTILLI:

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- 1 MS. GILMORE: Commissioner Pettigrew.
- 2 COMMISSIONER PETTIGREW: Aye.
- 3 MS. GILMORE: Dr. Doran.
- 4 THE CHAIRMAN: Aye.
- 5 Thank you. Any old business?
- 6 DIRECTOR LUCAS: No sir.
- 7 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Under new
- 8 | business I just want to talk about a few things.
- 9 We are voting on some budget issues tonight, and
- 10 | what I'd like to do is ask Commissioner Choffo
- and Commissioner Miller, and I can't remember who
- 12 else is on that committee, but to get together
- with Ray and start talking about some capital
- 14 improvement items that might be coming up as we
- 15 | formulate the budget.
- 16 DIRECTOR LUCAS: Okay.
- 17 THE CHAIRMAN: We have Mike Carlon on,
- 18 | and maybe he can give an explanation on the
- 19 budget, what we're doing.
- 20 DIRECTOR LUCAS: Are you talking about
- 21 | the late budget submission?
- 22 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, yeah. I think I'm
- 23 | familiar, but a couple of us -- what happened.
- 24 DIRECTOR LUCAS: So basically before I
- 25 | let Mike talk, what happens is HUD sends out this

- 1 budget submission form from HUD, we got it
- 2 February 4th. I do have to give Michael Carlon a
- 3 | lot of credit, because between him and Mo they
- 4 implemented it in three short days, which is
- 5 unheard of. So even though we got it in
- 6 | February, it says late, but officially it's
- 7 | really not late, it's been this way for the last
- 8 three years.
- 9 Michael, you can go ahead and speak on
- 10 | it now. I just wanted to get everyone familiar
- 11 | with when we got it and in three days we got it
- 12 done. So go ahead.
- MR. CARLON: Yeah, first I just want
- 14 to -- Dr. Doran, you had mentioned the capital
- 15 improvements. This is just an operating budget.
- 16 THE CHAIRMAN: Right. That's my second
- 17 item.
- 18 MR. CARLON: Right. So essentially,
- 19 this is basically just your rentals, your rental
- 20 | income and your operating, mainly your salaries
- 21 and your utilities and obviously all the
- 22 operations of the property itself.
- 23 DIRECTOR LUCAS: It's a two-part
- 24 process, Dr. D.
- THE CHAIRMAN: That's all right. Go

1 ahead.

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MR. CARLON: The process is normally we're getting nine months' financial results for the end of December, and we're projecting out to the end of the year and doing a budget off of that projected 12-month period. Ray goes through the salaries -- obviously the salaries are a big number -- Ray goes through the salaries and determines any increases that are going to be projected for next year, and then we also obviously go through all, each one of the line items to determine if there's anything unusual that happened last year that may not be recurring this year, or anything that may be unusual for next year.

And, again, when we're talking about unusual, I'm not talking about any capital improvements, because that's all handled on the capital program side. And those capital programs, you know, we typically have three or four years going at once; so we're finishing up, maybe finishing up a capital problem from 2018 or 2019 and starting to pull down on the 2020. So it's a little bit confusing because we have all these budgets around, but this, like I said, it's

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strictly the operating budget.

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So we have to submit this to the state within 60 days prior to year end, so that's essentially February 1st. So there's also part of the budget that is the operating subsidy, which essentially comes from your utility usage for the last three years. That's a formula that essentially HUD calculates, and again, it's a running three-year average of your utility usage, and then they'll determine what the operating subsidy is. So that's what Ray was talking They were a little late on that this year. Usually that comes out in the middle of January, and it didn't come out until February So we wanted to get, we needed to get the budget in for this meeting, so, you know, we tried to turn it around as quickly as possible.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any questions? Okay.

I'd like Commissioners Miller and Choffo to meet with Ray and Michael to get a handle on the capital programs, what things are coming up, what contributions might be, to make whatever changes. At least so that when the capital budget does comes up to be approved, we'll have some input from the Board on that.

DIRECTOR LUCAS: Well, I can tell you 1 2 right now, Dr. D, the main thing that we're concerned about here is the electrical upgrade in 3 Kingsland Court, which we're going through, which 4 5 we're on part of getting a, we would talk with 6 PSE&G, we got a whole lot of stuff done, we just have to put the bid out. 7 THE CHAIRMAN: Why don't you get them 8 9 together, Ray, and have some discussion on that. 10 DIRECTOR LUCAS: Okay, absolutely. 11 It's going to be a big overhaul. It's the 12 biggest thing on our list, and we're really not 13 worried about anything else. "Not worried 14 about," that's the wrong words to use, but that's 15 number one on our punch list, is the upgrading. 16 Because we still have the stuff from when this 17 place was built, and there's a lot of stuff 18 that's coming down. 19 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, you guys have some 20 discussion. 21 DIRECTOR LUCAS: Of course, of course. 2.2 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Dan, what day of 23 the week is good for you to sit down with Ray? Let me know. 2.4

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You want from me.

COMMISSIONER CHOFFO:

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Danny do you want to come to my office, do you
want to have food here? What do you want to do?

MR. CIARRACCO: Well, the only

potential issue I have is I'm scheduled for my

second COVID shot that day in the morning, so

17 unless I grow like a tail or something like that,

18 who knows. Everyone keeps telling me about the

19 | side effects after the second shot, so....

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Some good advice is -- I

21 actually got my second shot yesterday. A nurse

22 gave me good advice: For at least 24 hours, two

23 Tylenols every six hours.

DIRECTOR LUCAS: Say that again, Dr. D.

THE CHAIRMAN: The nurse gave me great

advice yesterday. Two Tylenols every six hours as soon as you get -- she said start before your shot, and for at least 24 hours after your shot.

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MR. CIARRACCO: You're not supposed to take it before, but now can I take that with vodka or not?

THE CHAIRMAN: Sure, as long as it has ice in it.

COMMISSIONER MILLER: Did I hear vodka?

MR. CIARRACCO: I want to make sure I follow these instructions properly, so yeah.

COMMISSIONER PETTIGREW: Well, you have to meet at the picnic for that to take effect, you know, your second shot.

MR. CIARRACCO: Whatever it takes. I'm on board, whatever it takes.

Just to give you guys that -- I don't want to, I'm sorry to interrupt, but HUD has not yet released -- and who knows when it will be -- the 2021. They have not yet awarded the Capital Fund Grant based on the appropriation. It should be consistent with the last two years, which is good, which is good news. And once they do, I go into Epic and create the updated five-year plan and the program. But for the most part, as Ray

had mentioned, most of this money we are likely to be earmarking for the electrical upgrade, which we anticipate being pretty significant.

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And, you know, we haven't even touched the 2020 grant, and we have some monies left from '18. We're mostly done, (inaudible) so we should be able to obligate some of that.

THE CHAIRMAN: Yeah, okay. What I'd like you to do to start with is bring the committee up to snuff as to what has been done, what the capital budgets have been, what is anticipated, at least so there's some history there, and get some input from the Commissioners.

DIRECTOR LUCAS: All right, no problem.

COMMISSIONER MILLER: If we come up, obviously it's a wish list of a capital budget, when would the grant be? Would it be 2022 or 2023?

MR. CIARRACCO: No, no, no. HUD awards, every authority is awarded a grant annually. The problem is we're sort of at HUD's whim relative to when they award this grant.

Some years it's by March. There's years it's been -- I've been doing this for 36 years -- there's years it's been as late as September. I

1 don't expect that to be the case. I expect hopefully by mid to end of March we will know what our 2021 capital fund award is. And then I 3 update the five-year plan, we go through the 4 whole process.

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COMMISSIONER MILLER: So for that request, the one from March was submitted last year, or is it from the budget we worked on? MR. CIARRACCO: No, it is separate, as Mike had mentioned. The Capital Fund Grant is separate from the operating budget, which is what you submit and get.

Now, there are components of the operating budget that are derived from the Capital Fund Grant. I won't get into too much detail, but the award is an annual award. automatic, it's HUD formula based, so we don't have to do anything. We essentially just wait for HUD to make the award, and then we go through the process of taking the five-year --

COMMISSIONER MILLER: If we get an award in April, that is from a grant we requested a year ago? I'm a new Commissioner, I don't know.

> MR. CIARRACCO: No, no, no. You guys

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are a March 31st fiscal year end. All of the subsidies, both operating subsidy and capital fund subsidy, are based on a calendar year. So the operating subsidy -- I'll give you sort of an example of how somewhat disconnected these items are relative to your operation.

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The 2021 operating subsidy, again, is January to December of 2021, HUD has not yet made the formula. They anticipate making the formula available through what they call these Excel tools and an operating subsidy portal that's brand new next Tuesday, February 16th, supposedly through Excel, and then you have until March 9th to submit the calculations.

The capital fund, again, different animal. We won't know until we actually get, HUD sends us a letter and says your 2021 capital fund award is now active, go into the Epic system and update your five-year capital plan, and you go through an annual process. It's an automatic grant. We won't know what it is until they actually advise us.

THE CHAIRMAN: It might be a good idea to send the commissioners the five-year capital plan so they can see that.

Okay. Well, the 1 MR. CIARRACCO: 2 current plan we have, again, it's what's referred to as a rolling plan, every year you update the 3 So the current approved plan is 2020 to 4 year. 5 Once they award the 2021 capital fund, we will now update it, it will run from 2021 to 6 And, again, it's just a forecast. And we 8 do that every year. 9 THE CHAIRMAN: Is there anything in there regarding projects and where it can be 10 11 spent and so forth? 12 MR. CIARRACCO: Yes, absolutely. 13 THE CHAIRMAN: All right. Be prepared, 14 if you could, be prepared to go over it with the 15 commissioners when you meet with them next week. 16 MR. CTARRACCO: Sure. 17

DIRECTOR LUCAS: Yeah. And, Dr. D, just so you know, we have as a Housing Authority gotten more money every single year for the last three, which is -- and Joe can speak on this better than I can -- that tells you that you are a high rated agency.

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You know, the agencies that kind of stay even or go below, there's an issue, you have a problem. The fact that we keep getting more
