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DIRECTOR LUCAS: Anything on the electrical? I know it was a little bit confusing for all of you, but if you want me to explain it briefly, I can.

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COMMISSIONER MILLER: That would be good for me.

what happened was we had the bid opening. What happened was the lowest bid was \$140,000. The highest bid was, I think it's 287, I have the numbers right here, hold on, give me a second. It was 287,000. When we opened up the bid me and Gene had paused because of the highest number, which is 287. The 140 seemed to me, it wasn't right. We had our engineer call the guy up. He said it was apples to apples. It was on a Wednesday.

On Thursday morning I called and told Maureen to get the engineers on the phone just because of the fact that I didn't sleep the night before with the \$140,000 bid. Something wasn't right. In reality, Hodges said he needed to come to my office and further told me that the bid was not right.

Basically what happened, Richard, in a

nutshell, was they priced 400 amps instead of 800 amps. That was the difference in the price. So they politely asked me to pull their bid, which in reality I could have done one of two things:

One, make them do the job at a loss, but at the same time if they get a job that's worth 400,000, I would be chasing them to come to my property to finish the Phase 1 part of it.

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So we interviewed the second company, me, Gene, myself, Hodges, in my office. We had a coming-to-Jesus moment, and I was very comfortable with the fact that he can get the job done. He knows that there will be no changes to the drawings whatsoever. I made that a point, and that things were going to be done the Harrison Housing way, which in return is my way. He agreed to every single thing that was there.

I vetted this company on two different occasions. They don't have any bad reviews out there. And I vetted all four of the people that were on the walk-through. I did not vet the two that weren't, because I didn't know they were going to put in a bid, Richard. We met with the guy, and we're firmly comfortable, I got a letter of recommendation from my engineer. Myself, Gene

and this Housing Authority believe he can definitely do the job. So with Board approval, we will award him the contract at 226,000.

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COMMISSIONER MILLER: And the original estimate from LAN Engineering was about --

DIRECTOR LUCAS: 298,000. Mine and Gene's estimate was in the 280 range. Again, I'm no electrical -- I don't have the experience you have, Richard, and I'd be an ass to sit here and say that I know more than you do, but my experience in the city and stuff like that, and Gene's knowledge of electricity, we put us in about 280, 285 at the most. LAN's was 298. The 226 -- and this is just based upon, ladies and gentlemen, all they're doing is building boxes next to the existing boxes so when PSE&G comes in and we run the wires up into the apartments, my tenants will be out of electricity for less than 30 minutes.

So with your recommendation, I mean, with our recommendation, myself, Gene, and the engineering company, we're more than comfortable with these guys doing Phase I of the job.

COMMISSIONER MILLER: The question I have, the number that we gave HUD was 293?

Page 12 1 DIRECTOR LUCAS: 298. COMMISSIONER MILLER: 298. So that's a 2. 3 savings of \$58,000? DIRECTOR LUCAS: Yes, sir. 4 5 COMMISSIONER MILLER: So can we allocate that to other projects in the area? 6 7 DIRECTOR LUCAS: Not necessarily. Because we estimated it, we don't have to line 8 item it at that number, right. What we estimated 10 is, the most I thought it would be, well, LAN 11 thought it would be 300. Me and Gene thought it 12 would be in the 280 range. 13 Now, I will say this: 226 covers all 14 three buildings, all three of them. So it's not 15 226,000 for each building. It's 226 for all 16 three. 17 COMMISSIONER MILLER: Right. With a 18 total of -- when I walked around the apartments, 19 what is that? 20 DIRECTOR LUCAS: There's 54 in each 21 apartment, so you're looking at 112.

20	Gardens that we have to take care of.

22	money can be reallocated.

24	thing about HUD is they don't lock us in. If we
