24	DIRECTOR LUCAS: You guys received my
25	Executive Director's report. I just want to give

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you guys little bit of an update on the 1 electrical upgrade that has been taking place for the last month and a half. The work is 3 approximately 55 percent complete. Work 4 5 activities include the installation of the underground service and entrance raceways 6 7 extending from the CT cabinet back into the basement. These areas have been backfilled and 8 seeded already. Threaded rigid aluminum conduit 10 has been extended vertically up the face of the 11 building to the weather head. The grounding for 12 the new electrical service has been installed. 13 New electrical panel boards, the back boxes have 14 been installed in two of the three buildings.

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The following items that still need to be done are as follows: The interior bus assemblies for the new panels are still in transit, we're having trouble getting our shipments in, as I'm sure everybody else is.

Vanore Electric is firming up on their estimated delivery date. These will need to be installed along with the circuit breakers that Vanore has already received. Modifications to the downspout to reconnect it to the existing cast-iron downspout; temporary connection has been made at

1 this time. We have to install exterior and

2 interior wiring. PSE&G needs to energize our new

3 | service, apartment (inaudible) connections.

4 PSE&G also has to disconnect our old services.

Demolition of old equipment, punch lists and then

the closeout.

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Vanore Electric has approximately three weeks of work to complete as noted, then Vanore will need to wait for PSE&G for the energizing and de-energizing of the services. This time frame is unknown, but I do have a friend in PSE&G, and they said that they will come out as soon as we need them, as long as it's ready to rock and roll. That will take another three days to complete.

Based on this information, LAN estimates completion of the project to be November 5, 2021. Now, if any of that changes, I will send all of you guys an email and let you know exactly what would be the reason for the holdup, but, as Joe knows, we do have protections for us inside this contract. If it's not done on time, they have to pay us money back, so I will also keep you up on that as well.

That's just a little extension, Dr. D,

of my electrical upgrade stuff. Other than that, nothing has changed from my report.

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THE CHAIRMAN: Very good, Ray. Just a quick question. Did any of the buildings suffer any damage from the storms?

DIRECTOR LUCAS: None, zero. We had had a little bit of flooding in basement three, building three, building five, but the guys were unbelievable getting it out of there. In building three we did have a waterfall, I can send you a video if you want to see it, it was literally a waterfall, but that was one of the tenants who had a tub overflow, so it had nothing to do with the storm.

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Also, I highly advise you in those type of situations, just as if it was any person on the street, that you do contact the Harrison Police Department.

Ms. Naranjo: Yeah, they did nothing. They did absolutely nothing to help Friday. I was told the police officer knew this person and would speak to her personally if I went home, and another incident happened. But I don't feel it should escalate to that again, because it's been numerous. Within the last two months there's been two separate occasions where I've been threatened, or my children.

MR. MANFREDI: Chairman, may I make a statement for Ms. Naranjo?

THE CHAIRMAN: Go ahead.

MR. MANFREDI: Ms. Naranjo, I'm Joe

Manfredi. I'm the attorney for the Housing

Authority. If you would provide that information
