THE CHAIRMAN: Okay, Karena; how are you?

MS. RORIDO: I'm doing okay.

THE CHAIRMAN: Good. Happy Valentines

Day.

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MS. RORIDO: I'm alive and well. Happy Valentines Day to you, too. The reason I'm here for the first time, I never wanted it to get to this point, but knowing that it is continued, I use the word harassment, and it started with somewhere since last year I was finding around my window -- I don't have a fence in the building where I am -- so I was continuing to find dog waste. I don't have a dog. And it was a constant, a constant amount around the area. So it got to the point that I was sick in December, I couldn't really get up, I got the flu, whatever, and I was smelling that very

1 extensively, it got to be more and more.

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Matter of fact, I never mentioned this to anybody, I did see a few times a man with a bald head walking his dog around my window. I never paid attention to it because I really, I'm a person that I mind my own business, I don't know who lives in what building. Even the tenants that live in my building, I don't know their names. The only reason why I know is because of packages. Other than that, I have no idea where they come from, who they are, and I mind my own. So besides that, I noticed that there was big waste right under my window, right under my air conditioner. And I was like this is too much, it's like they want to put it right on top of my window. So at that point I called the Housing Authority and I reported it, that not only was it there, but it was around the area.

So I don't know anything about dogs, I cannot take care of a dog. I babysit my mom's dog, my cousin's dog, but that's it. Four hours and I'm gone, like a baby, that's it. I don't even walk them. They have a house, they have property. It's fenced, so I don't even walk the dogs.

So anyway, I find out, I call, and they told me that it's all over the Harrison Gardens. I seen that all over, but I didn't want it to be so much in that corner to where my two windows So they told me -- I said, Well, what about the cameras? That was my question, my next question. And they were like, Oh, we're not going to sit there and look at the cameras. says, So how can I stop this? Because it's too much. It was all over here, here. I even have the pictures. So she said, Well, get your own So I did. I went, I went ahead and got cameras. my own cameras.

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So my camera started recording people that were not curbing their dogs. And I told them, I'll send the video, and they said, Oh, you have to find out the name. I don't know who lives here, not even in my building, as opposed to the whole entire eleven buildings in here. And I don't know how many apartments are here.

So I asked. I put it on Facebook, I didn't know what to do, and I said, Does anybody know who this person is? And they sent me a message, and they said, This is so-and-so.

Okay. So I reported it back, and I

said, This is who they said is so-and-so. Again, as they continued after that, and then like purposely, the same person that I seen before, I went to my car, I go outside, and I see the person walking his dog and my camera is recording. So they say, Oh, well, it's not his dog because your camera cannot record in that square box, the same square box that I have found waste before. Well, this is the dog that was in there, somebody would have to put it in there.

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So it was going back and forth. I got in arguments accusing me, and people from the town and from the building telling me that this is cat waste, and I'm like I've never seen a cat on my side, never in the years that I've been living in that apartment, and I've never complained about that. And it got that I was smelling -- I couldn't even breathe. And I'm smelling this through my window, because the next day it was -- the day that it happened it was raining, the next day it was dry, and so the smell is all over my apartment, and I open my windows. I'm sorry, I'm hot, and I'm always with my windows open.

And so the problem was that now I

1	complained, they continued to harass me. And I
2	told them, I said, I don't know their names, so
3	how am I supposed to give it to you? I have no
4	clue who lives here. I don't know. I go from my
5	apartment, my car, to throw out the garbage, or I
6	might go to get something to eat on the avenue,
,	and that's it

THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Karena, I'm not trying to cut you off. I think we've got a general idea. I'd like to ask Mr. Lucas. What is the dog waste policy?

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DIRECTOR LUCAS: The pet policy clearly states that dogs are to be curbed and not walked on the grounds.

THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Have we made the tenants aware of that?

DIRECTOR LUCAS: Yes, we sent out a letter immediately. We don't give out peoples' confidential information.

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, I understand. All right.

MS. GILMORE: The week that she called about the cameras it was the week of the situation, so that's why we couldn't stop to go look.

THE CHAIRMAN: Regardless of that, I don't necessarily --

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MS. RORIDO: And the other thing that I wanted to mentioned is that I have the handbook that was given to me when I started living here, and I have the Truth in Renting.

THE CHAIRMAN: Right, okay.

MS. RORIDO: A couple of years ago the kids in front of my house -- this is the second scenario. Where they were playing ball, and they broke the window in the basement to where my apartment is.

THE CHAIRMAN: It's happened.

MS. RORIDO: And so per my understanding of this housing book, if you read Page 20, it says that they're not supposed to play in the grass area. And it's written here. And so --

THE CHAIRMAN: I'm not disputing that.

Kids will play ball, and they'll play ball. I

mean, I have five schools under me, and you're

not supposed to play ball, and you can be sure at

one of the schools on any given day kids are

playing ball or doing something like that, and

things break when they do that. I understand.

MS. RORIDO: Exactly. And so what 1 2. happened is that they were aiming to my window. They did it before. 3 4 THE CHAIRMAN: Right. 5 MS. RORIDO: This was done before. 6 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. So you're saying 7 the basement window or your window? MS. RORIDO: No, my window. 8 9 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. When was this? 10 MS. RORIDO: When they broke the window 11 in the basement before, then they did it 12 yesterday. 13 THE CHAIRMAN: When was your -- your 14 window was broken yesterday? 15 MS. RORIDO: No, no, they didn't get to 16 touch it, but they were aiming the ball to it. 17 But my point is that the playground was empty,

DIRECTOR LUCAS: The family was spoken to today, Dr. Doran.

were aiming towards my window.

the basketball court was empty, the playground

was empty where the kids play, but, yeah, they

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THE CHAIRMAN: We don't -- the Board itself is not going to get into those types of disputes. If someone aims at your window, I

would say someone is looking to harm your property or your apartment, you might want to call the police. That's not something we would get ourselves into.

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Obviously we want to rules to be implemented and make sure that where ball playing is allowed, they play ball, and where it's not allowed, they don't play.

MS. RORIDO: And I want you to know that I don't have nothing against dogs, I don't have nothing against kids, but I feel that if the parents are looking, because they were looking, they should tell them this is where you -because here it doesn't say volleyball, okay, in this notebook it doesn't say volleyball, but it says baseball, softball are not supposed to be played in those areas. And I understand they're playing, I'm not saying no, but there was enough space in the area where they can just go ahead and play there. Don't aim to -- because my air conditioner, because if it falls on somebody's head, it's not going to be my responsibility. My responsibility is that I have my air conditioner in my window. And the reason why I'm here is because it's continued to be, I feel like it was

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a harassment issue to the point that every dog in the Town of Harrison was walking through any window and peeing in front of it. I mean, come on.

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THE CHAIRMAN: I can't speak to that specific problem one way or another. My thinking is if you think someone is harassing you, this is not the avenue to say that. You would really have to file a police report as to whose doing that, if you think somebody is harassing you. We don't implement disputes of that type from the Board. Our job is to set policy. We set the policy where ball playing is, and we set the policy for bills getting paid, we pay the electric bills, and we make sure all the fiscal needs are followed, and make sure that the administration of the Gardens is running things efficiently.

I haven't seen other -- I mean, they're implementing the policy. Does that mean you're going to catch every person who has a dog? Trust me, I've been a dog owner most of my life, and I used to walk my dogs in West Hudson Park all the time, and it frustrates the hell out of me when you see people who don't pick up after their

dogs, I understand your frustration. And I also have neighbors that feed stray cats and they poop in my yard. And it's frustrating, I understand what you're talking about. You know, you go out to enjoy your backyard and there's cat poop all over the place. So I understand that, and I understand your frustration. But, you know, I don't have a recourse --

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MS. RORIDO: And I understand. That's why every video is there being recorded. And anybody that just keeps on walking, I don't send it over here. I even have a dog going that has no leash. If I'm about to open the door and I step on that dog, am I going to be blamed because I stepped on the dog? So you understand? I think that rules have to be implemented.

THE CHAIRMAN: We heard that, and we're asking the Executive Director to make sure that the dog policy and the dog, the curbing your dog policy is followed.

MS. RORIDO: And that's all I'm asking for. Because I don't know what happens in the other -- not that I don't care, but I don't know what happens somewhere else. I just want to make sure that I'm respected the same way that I

dog, that is 100 percent.

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I live in the same building, I'm in the circle. I have a small, tiny little dog. By the time I get the dog downstairs -- I work all day -- and outside, my dog does his business before I even get to the curb. I make sure I pick up after my dog. I don't go to anybody's windows, I walk on the path, and he goes in the middle 99 percent of the time. And you have other people -- the reason why I'm here is the first thing that really got me aggravated is if I see my picture on social media, I think that's video voyeurism. Nobody's picture should be put on Facebook, Instagram, unless they're notified, That's the first thing. okav.

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The other thing, when you're walking your dog, I see a lot of people walk through that don't even live in the Gardens, and I seen a couple people and I said, Excuse me, are you going to pick up after your dog? Because we shouldn't have to pick up, or our kids or grandkids step in it. It's not fair.

Another thing. You see all these people walking around, and if they don't pick up, they should get fined. I agree with that 100 percent, okay. And like I said, I have a small

1 dog. But now you're talking about pet policies, 2. I see dogs around here that weigh more than 25 pounds, big ones. And I see people that have 3 more than two dogs, which is also against the pet 4 5 policy. But I don't say nothing, I keep my mouth 6 shut as long as they don't bother me. But there are a lot of -- I see Pitbulls that live here, which is against the policy. Your dog is not 8 supposed be to bigger than a certain height, 10 certain weight, okay. But I don't say nothing, I 11 mind my business. But if you're going to not 12 pick up after your dog, then there will be a 13 problem. If I know you, I'm going to let the office know. 14

And taking pictures with the camera.

Send it to the office, say, Listen, I don't know this person's name, but do you know who this person is. I've been here for 23 years, I've had a dog the entire time I've lived here, never had a problem, always picked up after my dog.

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And about the children playing outside,
I know specifically who they are. And they're
not friends of mine, but I know who they are.
They're out there playing. One's over here,
one's over here, and one's over here

- 1 (indicating), there's always three of them.
- 2 | They're not pointing at a certain -- they're
- 3 | pointing at the person. They're kicking the ball
- 4 to this kid, to that kid, to that kid, to that
- 5 | kid, and then back. I see them every day when I
- 6 | come home from work. I say hello to them, I'm
- 7 outside with my dog. And like I said, I try to
- 8 make it to Harrison Avenue or Hamilton Street, my
- 9 dog can't hold it. But I do pick up after my
- 10 dog, and I make sure my dog is clean, I make sure
- 11 everything is done.
- So if we want to talk about pet policy,
- 13 | I'll talk about the bigger dogs, and people that
- 14 do not live in the Gardens that walk their dogs
- 15 and don't pick up after them.
- 16 THE CHAIRMAN: All right. I would
- 17 assume the sidewalks are considered public
- 18 | sidewalks?
- 19 DIRECTOR LUCAS: Not inside the
- 20 | Gardens.
- 21 MR. MANFREDI: No, not inside the
- 22 Gardens.
- 23 THE CHAIRMAN: How do you keep people
- 24 out?
- DIRECTOR LUCAS: It's impossible.

- 1 MS. KOWALSKI: And I'm not going to say 2 nothing, it's not my job.
- THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Well, thank you for being a good pet owner. We appreciate that.
- 5 MS. KOWALSKI: I just wanted to let you know.
- 7 THE CHAIRMAN: All right. Hello.
- 8 MS. KELLY: Hi. Melinda Kelly, 720
- 9 Harrison Gardens.
- THE CHAIRMAN: Hello Melinda, happy
- 11 | Valentine's Day.
- MS. KELLY: Happy Valentines Day, how
- 13 are you?
- I was one of the ones that was on the video, and she couldn't prove that my dog went the bathroom, because we just walked past her window. So I do not want to be on a video
- 18 anymore or I will press charges.
- But can we please clear up that you
- 20 have to be able to walk your dog out of the
- 21 Gardens to walk them outside the Gardens? So if
- 22 | I walk past your window with my dog I'm leaving
- 23 the Gardens. So can we just clear that up, so
- there's no letters sent anymore about walking
- 25 your dog in the Gardens.

DIRECTOR LUCAS: We cleared that up this afternoon.

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THE CHAIRMAN: Good. Yes, to be clear, if you have to walk your dog, you are allowed to walk them out of the Gardens.

DIRECTOR LUCAS: You don't have to carry the dog.

MS. KELLY: I know some people -- it's getting that ridiculous that people are carrying their dogs.

MS. RORIDO: Can I say something? Dogs that just come through and through, never stop at all, those videos were deleted.

(multiple voices)

THE CHAIRMAN: Time, time. We have somebody that has the floor, and I'm trying to be gracious and acknowledge everyone, but I can't let the meeting turn into where everybody just speaks out, that doesn't help everybody. If you want to finish, I'll go back and give more time to everybody if we need to.

MS. KELLY: That's pretty much what I wanted to say. And, yes, the video was taken down after I made the comment that they don't show my dog using the bathroom, which he didn't.

So just don't post videos of people just walking past your window. It's a simple as that. You can't do that.

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MS. RORIDO: I don't know their names.

And I told them, I said, I don't know who they

are, and how am I supposed to find out? I told

them I don't know who they are.

THE CHAIRMAN: I would question that policy anyway. If you're bringing pictures in and saying, Who is this to a tenant, I'm not sure you're allowed to give that information out anyway. If somebody says to me, Who is this woman, and has a picture of you in your sweater and nice hat, I don't know if we'd be able to give that information out to anyone.

MS. RORIDO: Exactly. So I cannot tell you who's crossing the dog because, like I said, she lives in Building 7 and I'm in Building 4.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let's hope that people heed -- the Executive Director has sent out a letter. Let's hope that they heed the advice, and people who have dogs will pick up after their dogs so that you don't have this problem under your window anymore and you don't have to worry about filming anybody.

1	MS. RORIDO: Exactly. And when it			
2	comes to the children, and I sent the video, too.			
3	It was directly aiming, and I sat there and they			
4	switched themselves around. They did. They			
5	switched eventually after I got there. So the			
6	video is there if you want to look at it. If you			
7	want to criticize the video, you can go ahead.			
8	But everything was sent to them.			
9	THE CHAIRMAN: It isn't something we			
10	involve ourselves in. It's not really the duty			
11	of this Board to get involved in those things.			
12	So thank you, Melinda.
